



## **The Cheyenne Tribe**















## Spherical Case Shot



A hollow ball with .69 caliber lead balls inside.

Used mostly for anti-personnel purposes.

Types of Fix



Large can the size of the cannon bore filled with .69 caliber lead balls, placed in tiers and padded with sawdust. Turns the howitzer into a huge shotgun.
